112

- 112 is the european emergency number for all EU-countries
- That means that you can call 112 and get help independent of where in Europe you are

SOS Alarm app

- SOS Alarm is the official app for the Swedish emergency number 112
- SOS Alarm is the central point for all emergency resources, such as ambulance, police, fire brigade and rescue services including mountain and sea rescue.
- Your actual position will be sent automatically
 - No worries about coordinate systems
- The SOS-operators talk swedish and english.
- The SOS 112 app should also work outside of Sweden as it automatically connects to the emergency center of the country where you are.

Reach 112 from remote locations

- Sometimes it can be difficult to find the exact position when a person calls the emergency number 112 from a mobile phone.
 - due to that the person in need is in an area with poor coverage
 - the forest road to the summer house is not marked on the map
- The 112 emergency number can also be contacted by SMS112 service

Satellite phone

- For those who are far out in the mountains, in the middle of the forest or, for example, out at sea, a satellite phone may be needed to get in touch with SOS Alarm in an emergency.
- The emergency number to reach SOS Alarm via satellite phone is: +46 63 107 112.

Hjelp 113 app

- With this app you have all emergency numbers in Norway in one place
 - 110 Fire brigade
 - 113 Ambulance
 - 112 Police (and also for coordinating more complicated help?)

Collision with a larger wild animal

- Use also the SOS Alarm app
- You must mark the location and report it.
- This applies to: moose, roe deer, wild boar, bear, fallow deer, lynx, reindeer, red deer, otter, wolf, eagle, wolverine or mouflon sheep.
- In the event of accidents with other smaller animals, you do not need to report it.
